BUSINESS MANAGER REPORT: Olsen reported that as he prepared this, his last Business Managers Report, he was working on three different yearsøbudgets. He, Holtz and Tjernagel attended the Baird Budget Workshop this past Friday and began work on the 2017-2018 budget. The Annual Report for this year is finished, for the most part. General fund was reduced by \$200,000 (anticipated a reduction of \$310,000). Fund balance is 25% of budget and is used for things like the Sawyer roof project. This report is being presented early and no action will be taken on it until the December meeting.
