The publication slowly fell into dormancy to the point where the words "Clipper Collection" lost recognition. The magazine had become a relic until this year, when a group of individuals had the idea of reviving it. With the help of a student committee, Write On, Door County, the SBHS English teachers, and Mrs. Dee Paulsen, SBHS brought *The Clipper Collection* back to life with a spring 2018 release. Unlike past issues, this edition also features black and white artwork by current SBHS art students. Publication costs were covered by donations from John and Laurel Hauser and an anonymous source. This has been an exciting collaborative effort, and we are happy to offer a copy of the publication free of charge to anyone interested. Copies are available in the High School Office and will be distributed at various locations throughout the city.

Blood drive information. HOSA (Future Health Professionals) held one last blood drive of the school year on May 16. The group collected 60 units of blood, which surpassed their goal of 50 units. Thank you to all students and community members who donated. Through your efforts, we were able to save 180 lives! There will be a blood drive this summer at the high school. Please sign up at redcross.com. The American Red Cross offers a scholarship based on the units of blood collected throughout the year. This year, we collected a total of 284 units of blood (75 units more than last year), which equates to a \$2,500 scholarship. This year's recipient – Allison Alberts – was recognized at the Senior Awards Ceremony on May 31. Also recognized at Senior Awards were 13 students who successfully donated four or more units of blood throughout their four years of high school. - All parents and students must attend one of three Co-Curricular Code meetings. The meetings are scheduled for June 11, July 23, and August 13. All meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. and will be held in the Auditorium. Those unable to attend any of the three meetings must contact Mr. Meikle to schedule a personal meeting.
- The registration process for athletics participation will be the same as last year.
