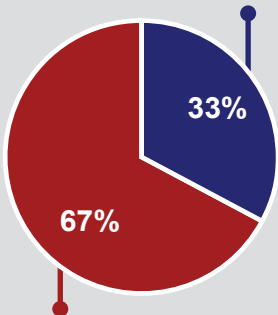

Facilities Planning Survey Results Are In!

In October, a survey was mailed to all District residents as an opportunity to provide feedback on potential solutions to address maintenance needs and increase efficiencies throughout the District. Feedback from the survey will be used to guide the District's future facilities planning.

KEY TAKEAWAYS:

79%

of all respondents encourage the District to explore a referendum to update our facilities.

75%

of all respondents support closing Sunset Elementary and reconfiguring the grades at the two remaining elementary schools.

prioritized

building systems, enhanced CTE programs, and building security at the Middle/High School.

Respondents were also asked to prioritize improvements at the Middle/High School. **Respondents prioritized** the projects in the following order:

- Update Building Components/Systems (Infrastructure)
- Enhance Career and Technical Education Classrooms and Labs
- Improve Building Security
- Renovate/Relocate Classrooms

Understanding that all projects could exceed \$30 million, respondents were asked to provide their willingness to **financially support** projects.

Respondents indicated they would **support a referendum** between \$15 million and \$20 million.
